The 10th Judgement, The 10th Plague: Death of the First-Born in Egypt Israel Freed from Captivity

Exodus 12:1-36; Hebrews 11:24-28; Romans 9:17; Psalm 105:26,36-38, Leviticus 23:1-2,4-8; Isaiah 35th Chapter; Romans 5:14-21; 1Peter 1:18-23; 1Peter 2: 21-24; 1John 2:24-25; Matthew 19: 16-17; 1Corinthians 5:7; , 1John 3:4; John 15:16; John 16:23; Hebrews 9:28; 1Corinthians 15: 19-23,26; 1Corinthians 15: 50-56.

(Recite) 1. It is now the first month of the year, the fourteenth day near midnight on the Passover. 2. The Children of Israel are inside their homes eating unleavened bread.

- 3. Israel's deliverance from Egypt is near! 4. No one was to be outside of their homes as commanded by Moses.
- 5. The Lord continues to show His power in the earth through Moses! 6. Just as the Lord had said, The Lord went through the land of Egypt.
- 8. At about midnight, the Destroyer will go through the land of Egypt. 9. The first-born in every home without the blood of the lamb on the doorposts were going to die! 10. Remember, that the blood was a token or a sign for the Lord to pass-over those homes. 11. That night, the cries of the Egyptians were great! 12. A first-born child in all of their homes had died! 13. That night, the Lord killed not just the first-born of man; but of beasts also!
- 16. Now, before Moses and Aaron had departed from the Pharaoh's presence, the Pharaoh had asked Moses to bless him also!
- 19. We also keep the service of the Feast of Unleavened Bread for seven days. 20. Beginning on the 15th day of the first month in the evening.

(Recite) 7. Everyone who had faith and believed the word of the Lord, they were protected by the blood of the lamb that was put on the doorpost of their homes.

(Recite) 14. The Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron and released the Children of Israel from captivity. 15. The Children of Israel were now free to go and serve the Lord in the wilderness as He commanded Israel to do.

(Recite) 17. Today, we keep the yearly Passover service on the 14th day of the 1st month, in the evening time.
18. The Passover lasts for only one day!

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24. Also, Jesus is our Passover. 25. Jesus never sinned! 26. Just like the lamb, Jesus did not have any blemishes or bruises which is sin. 27. Remember, sin is the transgression of the law! 28. This means that, to sin is to break God's commandments. 29. Jesus kept the commandments. 30. Jesus then died for us who have sinned.

(Recite) 21. We hold a feast on the 1st day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread. 22. We also hold a feast on the 7th day, during the week of the Feast of Unleavened Bread. 23. When we gather or come together, it is called a convocation.

32. For us who have sinned, we must repent! 33. To be forgiven, we must confess to the Father, in the name of Jesus that we are sorry and never try to sin again. 34. Now, in Egypt, during the time of Moses, those who believed put the blood of the lamb on the door posts of their homes.

(Recite) 31. Jesus was in the grave for three days and three nights and was resurrected back to life as a spirit being!

36. When Jesus returns at the first resurrection, the saints at that time will be changed into spirit beings. Other saints will be changed later.

(Recite) 35. Today, we must pray to the Father in the name of Jesus, the Lamb of God to pass over our sins that we may have a chance to live forever with Him, and not die.

39. By the 8th Day, Everyone will be spirit beings! Only then can the saints say that they have truly passed over from death to eternal life!

(Recite) 37. This is what the Passover, The Feasts of Unleavened Bread, The Feast of Pentecost, The Memorial of the Blowing of Trumpets, The Day of Atonement, The Feasts of the Tabernacles and The 8th Day Feast tell us! 38. They represent the time man has to repent for the wrong they have done, be forgiven of their sins, and to keep the commandments!
